Smart technology has transformed our lives indoors: we can now talk to our TVs and washing machines and unlock our front doors with only a smartphone. These handy gadgets simplify and connect our busy lives – and they’ve become must-have features for any modern home.

With the summer months just around the corner, there’s no longer any reason to limit this next-level connectivity to the indoors alone. ### Light the way

Outdoor smart tech isn’t an entirely new concept, and the product that’s paving the way for homeowners is smart lighting. Typically used in kitchens, task lights such as spotlights and under-cabinet lighting are installed above worktops so they can be used for specific jobs. This idea can be applied to a spacious garden by creating lighting designated for certain areas, such as a dining space or a quiet corner to read in.

You can’t have a summer party without music, so finding water-resistant smart outdoor speakers is essential. Amp up any get together with a speaker that will not only please the audiophiles but will also survive a dunk in the pool – audio brand Ultimate Ears has made strides in this area with its waterproof designs. Surround-sound systems can also be installed with in-ground subwoofers for those who are deadly serious about their sound quality. “These really help ensure that garden parties sound just as good as those in the house,” William says. “The addition of the subwoofer helps to fill out the sound that is often lost outdoors.”

To ensure your outdoor entertainment system will be the envy of all of your guests, take it a step further with a TV designed to withstand the elements.
